TITLE:	Extension of the Domestic Violence Perpetrator Programme (DVPP)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Further to decision notice 2021.025 - additional Home Office and PCC/VRU funding has been confirmed for the extension of the Domestic Violence Perpetrator Programme which will allow the intake of a further cohort on the agreed model.

Additional Home Office funding of £136,692 will allow the programme to be extended from October 2021 to March 2022.

Additional PCC and VRU funding of up to £127,752 will allow the programme to be further extended from April 2022 to September 2022.

The PCC is therefore requested to confirm her verbal agreement to provide additional PCC and VRU funding from the 2022/23 budget of up to £127,752 to enable this extension to take place. In addition the PCC is also requested to confirm her verbal agreement to provide an additional £14,049 from the 2021/22 budget to cover an over spend between April 2021 and September 2021.

Further decisions are also required around a number of procurement decisions associated with this extension funding.

INFORMATION IN SUPPORT OF DECISION: (e.g. report or business case)

The Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) and Nottinghamshire Police submitted a bid to the Home Office for funding to design, develop and evaluate a perpetrator programme for DV in September 2020. Funding was successfully secured from the Home Office in November 2020 initiating the development of the programme (see decision record 2021.025). The Home Office funding was tightly bounded to the delivery of a Domestic Violence Perpetrator programme (DVPP) in Nottingham and Nottinghamshire which is now known as the 'Your Choice Project'.

The initial Home Office funding was used to fund the first two quarters of the project (November 2020 to March 2021) with OPCC match funding being used to fund the programme from April 2021 through to the end of September 2021. Due to changes in the referral process the programme experience a slight overspend of £14,049 which the PCC agreed would be funded via the 2021/22 PCC Community Safety Grant.


In early September 2021, the Home Office provided confirmation that it will provide further funding to extend the project to the end of March 2022. This further funding is vital to the continued operation of the project as designed and agreed and will allow providers to continue to operate and take the next agreed cohort into the programme. The total amount of funding being provided by the Home Office for this extension is £136,962.

The PCC has also agreed to provide additional PCC and VRU funding which will enable the programme to be further extended from April 2022 to September 2022. This PCC and VRU funding amounts to up to £127,752 from the 2022/23 budgets.


The breakdown of spend and procurement decisions in relation to combined Home Office and PCC/VRU funding of £264,714 from October 2021 to September 2022 is as follows:


