TITLE:	Funding to support coordination of policing assets in order to provide an enhanced offer to tackle rural crime
	offer to tackle rural crime

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Under the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act (PRSRA) 2011, the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) for Nottinghamshire has duties to promote community safety and criminal justice within the police force area.

The Commissioner works in partnership to commission activities and services that are generally aimed at:

- preventing and tackling crime and disorder through proactive work and efforts to reduce offending and reoffending;
- providing an effective response to crime and community safety issues; and,
- supporting victims to recover from crime impact.

The Commissioner's local Police and Crime survey and community engagement evidenced concerns around crime and disorder in rural communities. Rural crime is defined as any crime or incident that takes place anywhere defined as a rural location, and the communities are often vulnerable and isolated. Analysis of the concerns raised showed a need to enhance the current policing and support offer to residents in those communities affected by crime.

The Commissioner has included a commitment within her Police and Crime Plan 2021-2025 to improve criminal justice outcomes, public confidence and satisfaction, community intelligence and the OPCC/ Force understanding of the impact rural crime offences has on local residents.

She has decided to provide an amount of £79,985 to Nottinghamshire Police to deliver activities that will achieve the following objectives in her Plan:

- Develop a process to improve engagement with rural communities and work to support and
 - strengthen local partnerships. This will include convening an annual rural crime summit to identify emerging issues and reviewing the OPCC's/ Nottinghamshire Police's progress;
- Improve processes for recording and reporting on specific rural crimes, such as farm machinery theft, fuel theft, fly tipping, poaching, livestock offences and equine crime – and for

- recording and reporting on crimes and ASB affecting rural communities more generally;
- Improve awareness and understanding of the impact of rural crime and explore options to
 provide an enhanced response to the most adversely affected victims of crime in rural
 communities where appropriate, including those affected by serious and organised
 criminality; and,
- Improve trust and confidence to report victimisation and the perception that action will be taken

as a result among rural communities by working with partners such as the Fire and Rescue

Service to provide visible and high profile rural crime interventions.
