Thank you for your request for information, which was received by the Nottinghamshire Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner on 12th November 2013.

INFORMATION REQUESTED

Police Dog Retirement Fund

- Why the program is a 3 years program (why not 2 or 4)?
- I don't get how the scheme will be financed? Fund based on charity?
- How many dogs are actually working for the Nottinghamshire police and crime commissioner?
- If I have understood it well, only the medical expenses related to work injuries / illnesses will be reimbursed?
- What about, the expenses due to old age and the general cares? Why they are not included in it?

RESPONSE

Under S 1 (1) (a) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA), I can confirm that the Nottinghamshire Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner does hold the information you have requested.

Please find below answers to your questions:-

- The programme is for 3 years as this is generally when we review policies.
- The programme will be funded by the Force with a possibility of exploring generating income from donations and fund raising work.
- There are currently 26 dogs working for the Force.
- The programme will cover the medical costs that are incurred whilst working for the Force. Many of the dogs retire fit and healthy. Some may sustain injuries/illnesses and require medication and treatment which is paid for whilst working. A dog that develops a condition after the first 3 years of retiring will be assessed by an independent veterinary as to whether the illness/injury is due to age of the dog, an unrelated condition since retirement or a condition more than likely caused by working conditions. If the latter is the case then payment will be made for treatment.
