Re: Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA)

Thank you for your request for information, which was received by the Nottinghamshire Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner on 30 March 2016.

INFORMATION REQUESTED

What are the public priorities in Nottinghamshire for the many aspects of policing (if possible I would like "road safety" to be reflected rather than a wider "safety" category) and how has such research been undertaken to ensure objectivity.

RESPONSE

Under S 1 (1) (a) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA), I can confirm that the Nottinghamshire Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner does hold the information you have requested.

Please find below answers to your questions:-

The Commissioner's Police and crime Plan (2016-18) includes a target set for the Chief Constable to reduce the number the number of people killed or seriously injured as set out below:

6	The number of people Killed or Seriously Injured (KSIs) on Nottinghamshire's roads	i) 40% reduction in all KSI RTCs by 2020 (from 2005-09 average)	To maintain a reduction in the number of persons KSI on Nottinghamshire's roads, in-line with the Nottinghamshire Road Safety Partnership target of a 50% reduction by 2020 (from the 2005-2009 baseline). ⁵¹
		ii) Monitor KSIs for 0-15 year olds	The number of KSIs for 0-15 year olds

This target has been in all his plans since he took office and currently the number of people Killed or Seriously Injured (KSIs) on Nottinghamshire's roads has reduced by 39.8% for adults and 45.4% compared to the 2005-09 average. This is a joint partnership target.

The research undertaken for the Commissioner's Police and Crime Needs Assessment (2015) identified Road Safety as an issue: "Risk of harm is also falling across almost all vulnerable road user categories with the exception of pedal cyclists killed or seriously injured. Despite these reductions, fatalities and injuries on the roads of Nottinghamshire continue to be a concern for the police, the public and other agencies."

The reason for target is because there are a high number of people killed or seriously injured on Nottinghamshire's roads.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your interest in the Nottinghamshire Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner.
