Re: Request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA)

Thank you for your request for information, which was received by the Nottinghamshire Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner on 20 December 2018.

INFORMATION REQUESTED

I would like to know, since the inception of the Nottinghamshire PCC'S responsibilities how many Nottinghamshire Police officers have been subject to a Pension forfeiture request by the Chief Constable. From that number I would also like to know how many actually resulted in a forfeiture being made.

From that I would like to know the nature of the offending that caused the forfeiture, ie Misconduct in a Public Office, Sexual Offences etc (Not personal details) and if any of these individuals were sentenced to prison. Lastly I would like to know the gender split in relation to those who have had the request made against them and the split on those who have actually had their pension reduced.

RESPONSE

Under S 1 (1) (a) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA), I can confirm that the Nottinghamshire Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner does hold the information you have requested.

Please find below answers to your questions:-

3 former officers have been subject to a pension forfeiture request by the Chief Constable.

2 applications resulted in forfeiture being made.

The nature of the offending in both instances was sexual offences and both were sentenced to prison.

All 3 former officers were male.
