At our recent Parish Council meeting and over the last few months, we have received an increasing volume of complaints by various residents regarding the issues with speeding through our village. We are aware that a recent speed and vehicle count took place on the 11th July 13, and as a Minor Authority we would like to request a copy of those statistics.

The Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act continues to protect the operational independence of the police by making it clear that the Chief Constable retains direction and control of the force, officers and staff.

As the Police and Crime Commissioner, Paddy is therefore unable to intervene with operational policing matters, this remains the responsibility of the Chief Constable.

The Police and Crime Commissioner's primary responsibilities are as detailed below:

- holding the chief constable to account for the delivery of the force
- setting and updating a police and crime plan
- setting the force budget and precept
- regularly engaging with the public and communities
- appointing, and where necessary dismissing, the Chief Constable

Paddy has however received correspondence concerning speeding in Linby from a number of sources and is communications with Nottinghamshire Police in this regard.
