Information 2021 - 2022

Police numbers are up and crime is down.

An additional 260 officers have been recruited in just two years. Numbers are growing faster in Nottinghamshire than nearly anywhere else, with another 100 officers coming in the next 12 months. By March 2024 almost 500 additional officer posts will have been created in just five years.

You were clear that you wanted greater police visibility, not just numbers. Today, every neighbourhood is benefiting from a proactive policing team, tackling the issues that matter to you.

This has helped to deliver a reduction in crime of around 20% - nearly twice the rate of the national average. We have added an extra sergeant and

six police constables to the Knife Crime Team and the latest figures show a 10% drop in knife crime.


The work to tackle violence against women and girls continues and, with partners, we have provided more funding for additional support services.

As we promised last year, a drone team is now in place successfully helping to catch criminals and find missing people, and we have introduced environmentally friendly vehicles

But there is more to do. I know that people want to feel safe in their homes and communities which is why there will be more officers out there, on the streets, tackling your priorities.

Budget for policing

The net budget for policing
Nottinghamshire in 2021-22 has
been set at £233.2m, an increase
of £13.6m over 2020-21's figure
of £219.9m. This incorporates the
Government's expectation that
commissioners will use the full precept
level announced in the funding
settlement (£5m) and the transfer
to core funding of operation Uplift
officers recruited last year (£8.6m)

The increase in the amount of council tax paid towards policing depends on the Band of the property.

The Police and Crime Commissioner

As Commissioner I hold the police to account on your behalf, providing a link between the public and your police force. I also commission a number of services to improve community safety and support the recovery of victims of crime. I consult with the public to find out what matters most to you, set the overall police budget and appoint the Chief Constable.

PCCs are not responsible for operational policing such as crime investigation or the day-to-day management of police officers, PCSOs and staff. This is entirely the role of the Chief Constable. I do, however, set local priorities for the police and our community safety partners through my Police and Crime Plan.
