AJ Sport	Make a Difference Mentoring Project	The project aims to support prevention of the grooming of young people/ children to become involved in gangs, crime, drugs and risky behaviour by engaging with local disadvantaged and disenfranchised children/ young people early at the grassroots in Lenton, Dunkirk, Lenton Abbey and surrounding areas. It will target forgotten and left behind, areas of high deprivation, involving some of the hardest to reach children/ young people in positive AJ Sport Academy activities through a range of activities and facilities.	£5000
Friends of Ladybrook Park	Active Outreach Project	The aim is to engage young teenagers, boys and girls who at this stage are on the fringes of anti-social behaviour. The project will be delivered by an experienced provider, after school and into the early evening based on evidence gathered by a pilot project.	£5000
National Holocaust Centre	The Holocaust and our world today	Linked to Holocaust Memorial Day, the project aims to visit five secondary schools in Nottinghamshire/City, where council/schools' officers/teachers/PREVENT recommend delivery of a programme on the Holocaust, including a session with a Holocaust survivor, who will speak live and answer questions from students. Two National Holocaust Centre and Museum educators will visit these five schools, over a period of five days.	£4000
South Leverton Parish Council	Community Speedwatch Gun	The funding is to allow the purchase of a speed gun which monitors the speed at which a vehicle is travelling on approach. The gun can be operated in appropriate areas where speeding is of most concern. It can also be moved around the parish by the trained users to avoid motorists becoming 'blind' to the sign.	£500
Stapleford Community Group	Montrose Court Community Hub	The funding will support the group to take on premises which would provide the community with a static location. The vision is for the hub to house all the existing initiatives the group run for the community; the weekly food bank, the youth diversionary schemes, the life classes, the job fairs. The additional offer is that of a warm space to provide tea and coffee to those that otherwise may find themselves socially excluded.	£2000
