The Pythian Club	Pythian Multisports	The Pythian Club have identified a need for a local community session which will be ran from the Heathfield Community Centre the home of The Pythian Club. This will be a weekly multisport session which will provide a focal point for community gatherings and activities, strengthening the sense of community identity and pride. The session will be delivered by the experienced and qualified coaches of The Pythian Club.	£5000.00
BBBB	Youth Mentoring Project	This project aims to support young people in Nottingham who are at risk of becoming involved in crime and anti-social behaviour. Through this project one-to-one sessions will run for young people aged 12-18 who have low aspirations, poor attendance and attainment at school, and low levels of engagement with group activities.	£4990.00
Belong Nottingham	ESOL and Engagement	This project will engage young asylum seekers and refugees living in hotel accommodation in our youth services and ESOL provision. An ESOL course will run initially, which is specifically focussed on families living in hotels. Young people will then be invited to attend regular youth sessions and activities so that they can get to know others and find out more about their new city. The ESOL course will run over three months with classes taking place twice a week. In addition to covering basic vocabulary and grammar, it will also serve as an introduction to the UK for people who have recently moved here.	£4994.20
Upper Broughton PC	Community Speed Watch	Once UB's four volunteers have received the CSW training, the community speeding concerns can be addressed by undertaking high-visibility roadside speed monitoring to raise awareness and alter drivers' behaviour. The monitoring will also support UB's proposal to reduce the speed limit through the village to 20mph.	£450.00

POW Nottingham	Outreach	The project aims to work with 75 individuals each year through street outreach. This will be done by ensuring services are accessible to the community, which includes providing 3 evening outreach sessions per week, visiting what is referred to as the 'red light' district of Nottingham. This involves POW staff and volunteers going out in the POW van 8 hours per week and providing several services.	£9805.00
Jericho Road	Street Outreach Project	The Street Outreach project visits Nottingham's vice area at least weekly to meet women who are working on the street. A separate weekly "walking outreach" takes place to the city centre also. The outreach team, which includes volunteers, offers a short respite, hot drinks, food, warm clothing and an opportunity to talk. They engage with women in a non-threatening and approachable way, helping to build trust and a develop a supportive relationship.	£10,000.00
Fifth Word	Your Voice	Weekly sessions will run at MyPlace@Westfield Folkhouse youth centre and Mansfield Palace Theatre; for young people aged 14-19 (or up to 25 if they identify as disabled). Sessions will create a safe space for young people to discuss issues that affect them; and to work together to create their own stories. Sessions will culminate in a digital showcase of their stories, as part of Mansfield Town Film Festival at Mansfield Palace in Summer 2024. These original short films will work to raise awareness in the wider community of issues affecting some of the most disadvantaged young people in Mansfield.	£5000.00
Empowerment for Heya	ArabSafe Nottingham: Building Inclusivity and Trust	The funding will look to help in providing a safe space for newly arrived Arab women, to reduce isolation, offer support, and help with their integration into the communities in which they live. They will also look to attend events around International Women's Day 2024.	£2000.00
Malt Cross Trust	Street Pastors	The main aim for the project is to offer practical, non-judgemental help and support to vulnerable people in the City Centre from 10pm to 3am on Friday and Saturday nights. The main objectives would be to ensure people's safety, nurture positive relationships in the community, listen to and help those in need, caring for those who are injured, hurt or unwell until further assistance	£10,000.00

Epic Partners	Epic 3x3 Basketball	Epic 3X3 Basketball project in Nottingham's Sneinton ward is designed to address pressing community challenges. This project targets young individuals aged 11-18, offering them an enriching and structured environment through the sport of basketball.	£4985.00
Al-Hurrayaya	Translate	The funding is to recruit interpreters to work alongside existing specialist counsellors to support vulnerable clients referred into the organisation that speak little to no English.	£5000.00
Chayah Development Project	Mix and Blenz Outreach Project	Chayah are looking to hold empowerment events inviting young people to actively participate in events at the Stapleford Hub. This hopes to bring young people together to engage and to help members of the affected community take steps to form empowerment youth groups, and to work closely with Nottinghamshire Police and other agencies.	£10,000.00
