# INTRODUCTION

## What is Safer Streets?

Safer Streets is a Home Office funded initiative to improve safety in public spaces and also to make people feel safer when they are out and about. It is particularly targeted at helping to reduce neighbourhood crime and antisocial behaviour and preventing violence against women and girls.

Police and Crime Commissioners work in partnership with local councils to bid for funding, which can be used on projects such as new CCTV cameras, street lighting, youth provision and home security devices. Mansfield District Council will deliver the project in Mansfield town centre with the support of the Safer Streets partnership.

## What is the money being spent on?

The Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Nottinghamshire secured £333,000 of funding for projects across the North Nottinghamshire Community Safety Partnership area, with half of this to be spent in the Mansfield district.

Mansfield District Council will use the funding to install two new state-of-the-art, 4G CCTV cameras as well as three Safe Refuge Cameras which allows the public to contact a control room directly with the push of a button.

As well as a new guardianship scheme which will result in more boots on the ground patrols around the town centre, paired with additional work to change young peoples attitudes towards the town to give young people a safe outlet for diversion and education.

## Which locations will be targeted?

The additional CCTV cameras will be located at the following places;

Leeming Street/Clumber Street, Market Street, West Gate (Library), Stockwell Gate (Old Meeting House area), Walkden Street.
