INTRODUCTION

What is Safer Streets?

Safer Streets is a Home Office funded initiative to improve safety in public spaces and also to make people feel safer when they are out and about. It is particularly targeted at helping to reduce neighbourhood crime and antisocial behaviour and preventing violence against women and girls.

Police and Crime Commissioners work in partnership with local councils to bid for funding, which can be used on projects such as new CCTV cameras, street lighting, youth provision and home security devices. Newark and Sherwood District Council will deliver the project in Balderton North with the support of the Safer Streets partnership.

What is the money being spent on?

The Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Nottinghamshire secured £333,000 of funding for projects across the North Nottinghamshire Community Safety Partnership area, with a portion of this funding being spent in Newark and Sherwood District.

Newark and Sherwood District Council will use the funding to carry out:

- Environmental Improvements. (Youth shelter, litter bins, life buoys)
- Three new HD-CCTV cameras in key locations.
- New street lights in key locations.
- New signage encouraging the reporting of antisocial behaviour.
- Youth outreach events to improve understanding of antisocial behaviour, wildlife and rural crime, and water safety.
- Creation of a Neighbourhood Watch scheme.

Which locations will be targeted?

Environmental Improvements - Balderton Lakes, Coronation Park and Lakeside Shopping Centre.

Three new HD-CCTV cameras - Balderton Lakes, Coronation Park and Lakeside Shopping Centre.

New signage - Balderton Lakes and Coronation Park.
