TITLE: 2014-5 Community Safety Fund – grants awarded

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Grant applications for the 2014-5 Community Safety Fund were assessed by two officers from Nottinghamshire Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner against a scored matrix. Stakeholder views about relevant project applications were also obtained from:

- City and County safeguarding boards
- Crime and Drugs Partnership
- Domestic violence leads in the city and county councils
- Nottinghamshire Police
- Nottinghamshire Probation Trust
- Safer Nottinghamshire Board

Following the assessment and consultation with stakeholders, recommendations were made to the PCC, Deputy PCC and Chief Executive on 2 April. It was agreed that 34 projects would be funded.

Since April funding for the following additional projects has been agreed:

- Malt Cross Trust: £2,000 to fund a temporary safe space in Nottingham City Centre whilst the permanent safe is refurbished
- Framework: £2,000 for volunteer expenses to run a "through the gate" mentoring programme with offenders requiring additional support
- Nottingham Mencap: £1,033 for materials to publicise "Safe Places" for people with learning disabilities

In total, 32 projects have been supported to a funding total of £368,922 community safety grant. An additional 5 victim support projects were funded to a total of £102,588 with Ministry of Justice funding ring fenced for victims.

Three organisations had been previously approved with £6,000 interim funding to continue 2013-4 projects until funding decisions for 2014-5 were made. All three projects were successful in securing 2014-5 funding. The interim funding previously awarded was included within their 2014-5 grant award.

The final list of approved small grants is attached for information and is published on the PCC website.
