TITLE: PCC Small Grant: Modern Slavery Protection and Prevention

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Modern Slavery and Organised Immigration Crime (MSOIC) Programme made £3,000 available to Nottinghamshire PCC in December 2020 for targeted activity to tackle modern slavery among vulnerable sectors of the community. Following consideration at the Nottinghamshire Anti-Slavery Partnership, the PCC agreed to support a bid for 6 'Traffic Jam' licences which will be piloted by Nottinghamshire Police over a 12 month period.

The software allows for quick searching of active and inactive Adult Services Websites (ASW) in order to identify and respond to risks relating to the sexual exploitation of both adults and children, and initiate co-ordinated partnership safeguarding responses.

In the identification of risk and potential victims, a process is necessary in order to develop the knowledge and the opportunities to act on this risk as part of a multi-agency approach.

INFORMATION IN SUPPORT OF DECISION: (e.g report or business case)

The pilot is proposed following recent positive best practice documented via MSOICU in the use of 'Traffic Jam' software (Operation Rose-Response to the Risk Identified on Adult Services Websites July 2019) by the Yorkshire and Humber Regional Intelligence Unit (YHRIU). Access to Traffic Jam within the YHRIU increased capacity to identify and respond to risk in a way that would not be possible from manual searches of the ASWs.

If successful, options to renew the licences will be considered as part of mainstream police budget.
