People Services

New Recruit Training:

As of the week commencing the 14th November, the force had the following cohorts in initial training:

2 x IPLDP cohorts – 40 students

1 x PCDA cohort – 20 students

1 x Degree Holder Cohort – 20 students

1 x PPD - 20 students

Operation Uplift -

Police Officer target for March 2023 is 2,428 – current headcount 2,429.

Sickness -

Police Officer – 4.56% including Covid, 4.14% without Covid. Police Staff/PCSO – 4.68% including Covid, 3.98% without Covid.

Highest number of calendar days lost relate to Stress, Depression, Anxiety & Psychological. The Pandemic, and Musculosketal are the second and third highest causes respectively.

Estates and Facilities

 New Strategy for 2022-2026 approved by FEB in February and PCC's Accountability Board in June, and reported in as a standalone paper at this Accountability Board.

Estate Improvements

- New building at FHQ completed and provides new, state of the art Control Room and Force Training Centre to deliver performance improvements in those areas. Also, value for money through achieved through a shared HQ (and cost sharing) with NFRS.
- Delivery of new SARC to ensure performance improvements and meeting latest Forensic standards now completed.
- Delivery of Mansfield Custody Suite improvements to ensure latest standards are met and all equipment is fit for purpose and functioning. The Suite has now reopened with some Cell Call system work still being completed due to availability of parts.
- Delivery of back up Custody Suite at Oxclose Lane for business continuity purposes.
 Now completed.
- New A & E Armoury also completed.

Facilities Management


- Work has continued at Chilwell to facilitate the move of the Forensic Vehicle Investigation team from Riverside and works at HQ to facilitate the move of the Dive Team from Riverside. These works are now completed. We have also planned accommodation solutions for the other Teams moving from Riverside later this year, this includes the NPT and SOC. Business Cases for these projects were agreed by FEB on 7th November and are with the OPCC for final sign off.
- The new Service Desk system Ivanti, is working well and is proving beneficial. In October there were 162 Service Requests and 174 Incidents raised – total 336 for the month.


